Bolton Council of Mosques (BCoM) is a representative body representing 30 mosques in Bolton, whose membership comprises of more than 90% of the Bolton Muslim population. The managerial structure at BCoM is based upon democratic principles, where members of the executive board are voted in by the managerial committees of each

member mosque. This enables the executive members of BCoM to have a firm and clear mandate to represent the vast majority of Muslim Boltonians with one voice throughout their tenure.

In the past year, during the COVID -19 pandemic when people, not only in Bolton, but nationally and globally, have suffered through ill-health, bereavement, financial restraints, loss of regular incomes and mental illness, BCoM has stood firm and resolute in supporting and helping those most in need. Services people depended upon BCoM to provide, remained functional in adherence to government COVID-19 guidelines during these incredibly challenging times.

The funeral service provided the essential support and service to those bereaved. The Admin Staff whilst working from the BCoM office or from home, remained accessible to signpost people to relevant help and support available, whether at BCoM itself or to external agencies. The counselling service remained busy providing much needed therapeutic support through phone or Zoom sessions and so on.

The Executive Board at BCoM cannot be prouder of their staff, supporting agencies and their volunteers for their contribution in supporting Boltonians who faced adverse situations in their lives during the past year.

The Executive Board Members at BCoM wholeheartedly express their gratitude to all its staff and volunteers who worked

tirelessly and sacrificed their time and effort, to aid our quest to better the lives of others.

To showcase the work BCoM and its staff carry out and to create awareness of the projects Boltonians can access through BCoM, BCoM will produce a quarterly Newsletter for mass online distribution. This is the first of its kind and we duly hope you enjoy its contents and publicise it as much as possible to other people too. We want Boltonians to know and be reassured that we are working hard to align our services with the wider Bolton 2030 vision and improve the lives of Boltonians.



- Increase of confidence and self-esteem




### **Answer Cancer Campaign**

- To ensure those hospitalised and unable to communicate with their loved ones had a visit from one of our volunteers to ensure their wellbeing and to inform their loved ones about their care and recovery
- Provide them with Quran Cubes and iPads
- Support the NHS Staff with food





## Supporting the community at its most vulnerable time

BCoM Funeral Service has conducted sixty six funerals since the second lockdown in January and 390 funerals in the year 2020. When a death occurs in the Muslim community, our Funeral Director and other volunteers are with the bereaved family at every step of the way providing guidance and support. Our Funeral Team organise the burial, prayer facilities, bathing and the shrouding along with the bereaved family.

Thereafter, our counselling service is freely available to provide such intervention if it is needed.

During the pandemic, adherence to the government strict guidelines for burial were not only explained to the bereaved families but they were supported through each step.

## BCOM Counselling Service

BCoM Counselling Service has continued its support and service for all Boltonians during the pandemic and the lockdown. It has continued to provide this vital service via Zoom and telephone. **BCoM Counselling Service is a member of the British Association** of Counselling & Psychotherapy (BACP) and all its counsellors are qualified to a degree level to provide such an intervention. The service is free for all and has been since its inception in 2007. The service is unique in the North West because of its understanding of the cultural and religious sensitivities of its clients.
